Each summer Gary travels to many areas served by SVAN entertaining and teaching children about the music to which he has so passionately devoted his life and career. The two-hour programs, which are free to attendees, include performance as well as lots of audience participation. Gary sings and plays a multitude of instruments and ends his presentation with awarding lucky attendees with an instrument, usually a penny whistle or a harmonica. He then teaches a short basic music lesson on the spot followed by a brief concert by the new musicians. You can imagine the delight!

Gary's faithful dedication to "Adventures In Folk Music" is one way the Music Committee's mission to bring music of all varieties to as many folks as possible is fulfilled. Programs ranging from Piseco to Gloversville, Hadley to Mayfield will continue in 2010 with SVAN funding, thanks in part to you, the members.
